Victor Valley Shred Event & Compost Giveaway

Date: Saturday, November 2, 2024 **Time:** 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

Where: Victor Valley MRF Recycling Center • 17000 Abbey Lane in Victorville (just off Stoddard Wells Road)

Shred Event Details:

Please bring proof of residency such as driver's license or identification.

Free confidential on-site document shredding. *Shred event ends at 12:00 p.m. or when truck is full.

What to bring:

- Residents may bring up to 4 boxes (banker box size, 12" x 10" x 16") or 4 bags no larger than 15-gallons per person.
- Please only bring paper that should be shredded (most junk mail does not need to be shredded). Magazines, phone books, catalogs, etc. will not be accepted.
- Walk ups are not allowed. For your safety and to ensure everyone is treated fairly, please drive through the line and do not get out of your car. Staff will unload your materials and take them to the onsite shredder.
- There is no cost to residents for this service.

Compost Giveaway Details:

- · Free to residents, while supply lasts!
- This is a self serve event so please bring sturdy bags, pails, containers, gloves and a shovel to take and load your compost. First come, first serve.

Benefits of Compost:

- Helps retain moisture to reduce watering
- Suppresses weed growth
- Controls erosion
- Provides beneficial nutrients to improve soil

State Required Contamination Monitoring of Recyclables

California state law SB 1383 requires jurisdictions to monitor trash, recycling, and organics barrels to minimize contamination. Please review the "What Goes Where" guide for reminders of acceptable items in each barrel. Recycling loads containing unacceptable items may be rejected for processing and sent to the landfill, which eliminates the benefits that are produced from the recycling program. High contamination of your recyclables could result in increased processing costs which may impact your trash and recyclables collection fees.  Antifreeze • Batteries • Fertilizers • Household Cleaners • Medications • Needles in sharps containers • Paints • Pesticides & Herbicides • Pool Chemicals • Propane Tanks • Used Motor Oil
