How to Collect Food Waste at Home

- 1. **Collect-** Begin collecting food waste separate from your trash and recycling. This includes: fruits, vegetables, meats, seafood, bread, dairy, eggshells, coffee, plate scrapings, peels, rinds, and food soiled paper such as napkins and coffee filters.
- 2. Add & Secure-Collect food waste & food soiled paper in its own separate plastic lined container. Store it in a convenient place, such as on your counter top, in your refrigerator or under your sink. Secure plastic bag by tying it off. Remember bags do not have to be compostable or biodegradable. They can be any color. We encourage you to re-use bags you may already have such as bread bags and produce bags.
- 3. Discard- Place your bagged food waste & food soiled paper into your green barrel, along with your green waste. Continue using your green waste barrel as usual. Remember, food waste no longer belongs in your trash barrel.

Bulky Item Pick-Up

Are you replacing an old sofa, water heater or refrigerator and don't know what to do with it? We'll take care of it! Residents on trash barrel service can request up to four (4) curbside collections of large or bulky items during a 12 month period. Limit of five (5) items per collection. This program also includes electronic waste. This program is at no additional charge and designed for your convenience. Please call Burrtec's Customer Service Department to arrange pick-up on your next scheduled collection day. Additional pick-ups are available for a fee.





Extra Holiday Waste

Approximately 80% of your holiday trash is recyclable. All gift boxes, wrapping paper, greeting cards, and cardboard packaging are items that may be placed in your recycling barrel. Burrtec will collect your excess holiday trash and recyclables. Beginning the day after Christmas for approximately 1 week, place excess holiday trash/ recyclables in bags alongside your containers on your collection day.

The Holidays Are Soon Approaching!

Burrtec will collect and recycle Christmas trees from singlefamily residences. Please place your tree at curbside after Christmas on your collection day. Burrtec will provide this service for approximately a 2 week period after Christmas Day. Trees 6 feet and over need to be cut in half. Please take all ornaments, lights, and metal stands off of the tree. Flocked trees will not be recycled, they will be collected as trash. Flocked trees 6 feet and over also need to be cut in half.

When the holiday falls on a weekday, collections for the remainder of the week will be delayed by one day. There is no service interruption or delay when the holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday.

Household Hazardous Waste

San Bernardino County collection facilities accept a wide variety of household generated hazardous wastes. These services are FREE for San Bernardino County and City of Montclair residents only.

Collection Facilities

Will Accept Household Generated:

- Weed Killers, Cleaners, Gasoline, Antifreeze
- Wood Preservatives, Paints & Paint Products, Paint Thinner
- Auto & Furniture Polish, Chemical Drain Cleaners
- Pesticides & Fertilizers, Pool & Hobby Supplies
- Auto & Household Batteries
- Motor Oil, Oil Filters
- Electronic Waste Collection available throughout San Bernardino County. Call 1-800-Oily Cat for nearest location.
- Outdated Medications

Before transporting household generated hazardous waste to a collection facility be sure...

- ✓ The amount of waste transported does not exceed 15 gallons or 125 pounds. Container volume must not exceed 5 gallons.
- ✓ The containers are sound, not leaking and sealed.
- ✓ The waste is in its original container or is properly labeled as to its contents.
- ✓ Waste is placed securely in the vehicle for safe transport.
- ✓ The contents of the container are the same as stated on the label. If not the same, cover up the label and write the name of its contents.
- ✓ To place items in a cardboard box. Wrap glass bottles in cloth or newspaper so they do not break while transported.
- ✓ To place the cardboard box in the trunk of your car or in the bed of your pickup truck. Keep items away from passengers.
- ✓ To follow directions once you reach the collection site.
- ✓ That at the site, staff will unload the chemicals from your vehicle. You will be asked to stay inside your vehicle.
